

WASH-I-BAGOS' RALLY COMMITTEES
BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

HOSPITALITY – The Hospitality Committee is responsible for setting up the hospitality area, providing coffee (decaf & regular), tea, hot & cold water, (other beverages optional) and cookies during each day of the Rally. Timers are supplied for each coffee pot for early morning settings. To have coffee ready at 6:30am pots need to be timed for 5:30am. Supplying fresh beverages, frequent stocking of cookies is essential and keeping area cleaned up. If bleach is needed for cleanup will be available from clean-up committee. (Solicitation of cookies from Club members including diabetic cookies should be coordinated with WASH-I-BAGOS officers and request for cookies put in newsletter.) Also a sufficient supply of beverages is to be provided for each meal.

Although WASH-I-BAGOS provides coffee pots and beverage containers, other supplies are to be purchased, i.e., coffee, tea, juice mixes, substitute sweeteners, reg. sugar packets, etc. bills submitted to treasurer. (Traditionally Rally participants are asked to provide their own coffee cups.). Dealer/vendor box provides coffee cups only for them. Update inventory list enclosed in supplies and pass on to next Hospitality Committee. Reminder: Hospitality is not for the purpose of filling personal thermoses. That can be done in individual coaches.

As a guideline and from excerpts of NW07 committee reports: 6 ½ three lb. cans of regular coffee and 2 – 3 lb cans of decaf coffee were used. Also 4 containers of juice/lemonade (5 gallons each) were made. In addition the cold water container was refilled several times a day and made numerous pots of hot water. On Saturday morning 800 cups of coffee were served alone. (Relative to activities).

Sunday Morning Grab & Go Breakfast: 1 ½ cups of regular coffee and ½ 50 cup pot of decaf, approximately 1- 50 cup of hot water. Note: A lot of cookies were donated but need more diabetic as they ran out the first. Extra cookies left over were donated to homeless shelter.
